



Initial Overview of the New QI/QM Report

Get The Facts! [as we know them now]

The Quality Indicators are changing. This WILL have **significant impact** on your survey process

The QI Report format is changing. Quality Measures will be provided in the same report as the Quality I indicators. Quality Measures have replaced QI's when their definitions are similar {although they may not be identical}. Some QIs with no equivalent have been retained and not changed. QM/QIs will be re-numbered and have increased from 24 QIs to 35 QM/QIs. **These changes are scheduled to become effective June 19th.**

Ten Quality Indicators will be replaced by Quality Measures.

Old Quality Indicator	New Quality Measure	COMMENTS
QI# 4-Prevalence of Symptoms of Depression	2.1 Residents who have become more depressed or anxious	This new measure is an <i>incidence</i> measure and may have quite different values. {occurred from one assessment to the next}
QI# 8 Lo-Prevalence of Bladder or Bowel Incontinence: Lo Risk	5.1 Low-risk residents who lost control of there bowels or bladder	
QI# 10-Prevalence of indwelling catheter	5.2 Residents who have had a catheter inserted and left in their bladder	New Formula with co-variants
QI# 12-Prevalence of Urinary Tract Infection	6.1 Residents with a Urinary Tract Infection	
QI# 13-Prevalence of Weight Loss	7.1 Residents who lose too much weight	New Exclusion: any resident for which hospice is coded on MDS.
QI# 17- Incidence of Decline in Late Loss ADL's	9.1 Residents whose need for help with daily activities has increased	New Exclusions – comatose, end stage disease & hospice
QI# 16-Prevalence of Bedfast residents	9.2 Residents who spend most of their time in bed or in a chair	New Exclusion -- comatose
QI# 22-Prevalence of Daily Physical Restraints	11.1 Residents who were physically restrained	
QI# 24 Hi-Prevalence of Stage 1-4 Pressure Ulcers- High Risk	12.1 High-risk residents with pressure ulcers.	
QI# 24 Lo- Prevalence of Stage 1-4 Pressure Ulcers-Low Risk	12.2 Low-risk residents with pressure ulcers.	

Three Quality Indicators have been dropped without replacement

- QI #8: Prevalence of Bladder or Bowel Incontinence;
- QI #8 HI High Risk Prevalence of Bladder or Bowel Incontinence
- QI 24: Overall Prevalence of Stage 1-4 Pressure Ulcers.

Five QMs have been added to the new QI Report – *These measures will be a part of your survey process*

1. 8.1 Residents who have moderate to severe pain
2. 9.3 Residents whose ability to move in and around their room got worse

Three Post-Acute Care {PAC} Measures; *these are taken from PPS assessments*

3. 13.1 Short stay residents with delirium
4. 13.2 Short stay residents who had moderate to severe pain
5. 13.3 Short stay residents with pressure ulcers

CMS FORM 802 {Roster/Sample Matrix}

Updates are expected soon from CMS; we anticipate a new Appendix P.

The QI/QM has a new report that can run for each QI/QM called **Monthly Trend Report** that will be useful in your QI/QI Process.

Calculation Frequency Differences Between the Old MDS QI and New MDS QI/QM Reports

The data on the old QI reports was recalculated following each submission of assessment records. The data on the new MDS QI/QM reports will be calculated on a weekly basis instead. The calculations will be performed early every Monday morning and the values on the reports will be constant until the calculations are performed again the following Monday. If you run your report on Tuesday and again on Friday the calculations will not change. There have been no announced changes to reporting on NH Compare..
